




Project Activities

Project Studies in Europe this summer

DICAMP students will have the opportunity to do either a 6 weeks project studies or a 12 weeks master thesis in Europe. Every student carries out one work within a local institution and one abroad. Eighteen of our 30 DICAMP students will do their project studies from May until September 2013 in Europe while the other twelve will do it at Tunisian institutions. In February the project partner HSWT (Weihenstephan-Triesdorf University of Applied

Sciences) announced an official list at which European institution each of the 18 students will do his/her project study and on which topics.

Students are allocated to topics, depending on criteria such as their research interest, motivation and results achieved so far in the master programme. Currently European project partners are organizing travel, accommodation and dealing with administrative issues for their DICAMP students who will come to their institution. Besides research, studying and writing their project work, the students are also invited to experience European culture by exploring life in a different country.





Project Activities

DICAMP Library - textbooks have been ordered



Textbooks are important students in order to assimilate the contents of the courses and for lecturers to provide guidance students. Online scientific journals enable students to have an access to a large database of latest scientific research in the area of innovation management. Within the last month every European lecturer working with



their Tunisian teams identified textbooks, on which his or her course will be mainly based. Accordingly, the titles of the required textbooks were sent to the University of Exeter, which placed one order with 1174 textbooks. The University of Exeter will also manage the shipment of the books to Tunisian universities in order to build up our DICAMP library. In addition, an online access to top innovation management scientific journals for a period of five years will be supplied for the Tunisian universities participating in this consortium.







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
